NINETEEN SEVENTY-THREE WILL SEE MOVEMENTS TOWARDS:-
 HOMOSEXUAL FEMALE COUPLES BRINGING UP THEIR OWN CHILDREN: WHETHER BY ADOPTION, FOSTERING, ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION OR MARRIAGE. HOMOSEXUAL FEMALE COUPLES BEING RECOGNISED IN LAW, SOCIALLY, FINANCIALLY AND BY THE CHURCH AS HETEROSEXUAL COUPLES ARE. THAT AS THERE IS NO PENAL OFFENCE AGAINST HOMOSEXUAL FEMALE COUPLES IN CIVVY STREET - HOMOSEXUAL COUPLES WILL NOT BE PENALIZED OR CASHIERED FROM THE SERVICES AND THE POLICE. THAT NO LESBIAN IS FIRED FROM HER JOB BECAUSE OF HER SEXUALITY. THAT ALL AND EVERY RIGHT AVAILABLE TO HETEROSEXUAL COUPLES ALSO APPLIES TO FEMALE HOMOSEXUAL COUPLES. THAT LESBIANS MAY INTEGRATE INTO SOCIETY OPENLY AND HONESTLY, NOT ONLY IN THIS COUNTRY - BUT ALL OVER THE WORLD. SOLIDARITY TO ALL SISTERS. RIGHT ON AND ON...
